

- You can be part of that!




Want to pre-compile?

- Rakudo Perl 6 allows for pre-compilation of code
- Loading pre-compiled typically ~120x as fast
- Think about it: with 'use v5'
- Your Perl 5 cgi-bin scripts could load faster

Great news: natives

Awesome, thanks to JIT. Here, we're 14x faster than Perl 5, and 355x faster than 2013.08!

No time to write XS?

- Jitting of Rakudo Perl 6 does that for you!
- Your carefully written Business Logic
- May lose its performance issues automagically
- In combination with '**use v5**' if you're using Perl 5



- If you want to contribute to Perl 6
- There is **always** something you can do!
- We need more people looking at documentation
- Writing tutorials, or simply just try things
- And tell us there's something amiss (if there is)

- git clone https://github.com/rakudo/rakudo.git
- cd rakudo
- perl Configure.pl —gen-moar
- make install
- install/bin/perl6 -v
